April marks a new milestone of my life. My wife and I departed from our acquainted place: people and environment. In response to God's calling, we came to the unfamiliar city of Boston and joined the extended family of Chinese Baptist Church of Greater Boston.

As early as a week before moving to the Greater Boston area, a sister in Christ, who is also a professional realtor, had already found a suitable apartment for us. She even completed the rental process and arranged for cleaning of the premises for us. Also, another sister in Christ paid the rental deposit for us. On the day we drove down here, there were seven brothers and sisters in Christ helping us move. The moving process was completed in less than two hours!

I can still recall the first encounter with the brothers and sisters in the church. It was a Jacob Fellowship gathering on a Friday evening and it happened to be on the second day of Chinese New Year. It surprisingly turns out to be a very successful event. Apart from the regular Jacob fellows, other senior church members and deacons also showed up to meet me. Even though it was our first time meeting them, my wife and I did not feel like a stranger. The enthusiasm of brothers and sisters has shattered all the barriers between us. Since that meeting, their names have been branded in our minds. They even appeared in my dreams. I truly believe that God has bonded us together.

Times flew by and I have been among you for more than two months. It has been a rejoicing ministry in this congregation. This is all because of your respect for the minister, the shepherd, and your unfading passionate love for us. My wife and I are very grateful to God for your sincere faith and love. With a trembling heart we picked up our lessons in pastoring. Without a doubt, we are not counting on our own strength, but relying on the Lord God, the father of our Lord Jesus Christ. As such, we are willing to take up the mission and be totally committed.

From my past ministering experience, I believe that unity in Church is of utmost importance. We must serve with one heart, not for our own fame, but for the glory of God. To begin, we must know each other well, as described in Ephesians 4:2-3, "Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace." The purpose of God's calling on us is to serve together, to advance the gospel, and to anticipate by faith the return of Lord Jesus.

Therefore our service must have a goal (a vision, a commitment) and top it with action (sow the seeds, spread the gospel) and individual spiritual revival. Have I experienced the life changing power of God? Do I have joy in ministry? Was I thrilled to spread the gospels to others?

To set the goal for ministry, we can start with something short term, such as every year, each one of us will bring a person to Christ; preach the gospel to at least one person each and every

In terms of action, we can plan on inviting a friend or relative to the evangelical meeting in the evening of September 20; taking part in personal evangelism, visiting ministry, etc.

For revival, we shall make plans to attend the church's revival meetings; dedicate a certain time of the day for devotional; spend time in fellowship with God five or more times per week; attend the Tuesday night weekly church prayer meeting, etc.

In summary, God calls us to form His church, the body of Christ, and we as individual members, are intimately linked to each other. We should use our various gifts to serve God, edify each other, fulfill our duty, and become mature to attain the whole measure of fullness of Christ. Our unity should not be just in religious faith, but also in action: seize the opportunity of one to one evangelism, preach the gospel at least once, and have devotional time everyday. May God bless each and every one of you!
