Real Freedom

We came across this issue in our recent Bible study prayer meeting. God hardened Pharaoh's heart so that he did not let the Israelites break free from slavery. As such, it should not be counted as a sin of Pharaoh, but God's doing. I hereby sum up the opinions from Bible commentary and my own perspectives.

- 1. God predicted the hardening of Pharaoh's heart.
- 2. God allowed Pharaoh to harden his heart.
- 3. Pharaoh hardened his heart in the beginning. God's hardening of Pharaoh's heart only began at the time of the seventh plaque.
- 4. God intended to break the superstition of Egyptians, their practice of placing beetle shaped precious stone on the heart after death to release man from their guilt, so as to elude judgment. But, God hardened a man's heart to make them come to terms with their sins.
- 5. The sovereignty of God was demonstrated, to reveal His majesty and might so that man will revere Him. In spite of that, man still have the choice of repenting, to make God relent from sending down the disaster.

When we study the book of Romans, we can see the perspectives of Paul:

17 For Scripture says to Pharaoh: "I raised you up for this very purpose, that I might display my power in you and that my name might be proclaimed in all the earth. 18 Therefore God has mercy on whom he wants to have mercy,

and he hardens whom he wants to harden. 19 One of you will say to me: "Then why does God still blame us? For who is able to resist his will?" 20 But who are you, a human being, to talk back to God? "Shall what is formed say to the one who formed it, 'Why did you make me like this?" 21 Does not the potter have the right to make out of the same lump of clay some pottery for special purposes and some for common use? 22 What if God, although choosing to show his wrath and make his power known, bore with great patience the objects of his wrath—prepared for destruction? 23 What if he did this to make the riches of his glory known to the objects of his mercy, whom he prepared in advance for glory— (Romans 9:17-23).

Some people have a negative view of this scripture. They found God tyrannical and unreasonable. Human are at the mercy of God, with no recourse. They are just a lump of clay. Their destiny is totally decided by God's will. Such is the mentality of sinners. Their rejection of God's sovereignty generates dispute and distrust of God. We must first assert that God is righteous, just, upright, gracious, abundant in love and flawlessly good.

Harris and I took the British Airway from Boston to Hong Kong through London. Everything was fine on the airplane initially. We expected arrival at London in seven hours. To our surprise, we felt that the plane was turning around after six hours. Then the pilot announced that landing at London was no longer feasible due to vicious snow storm. He had to choose a suitable place to land, namely, Iceland. I was wondering in my heart, why fly to Iceland while there is snow storm in London? Arriving at Iceland, I did not find any ice; it was just a frigid place. I was grateful for God's provision of a nice hotel. However, dinner was not adequately served. I really missed the half serving of roast chicken sandwich I left on the

plane. Under such circumstances, the pack of small cookies given by my daughter became especially tasteful. We could also send out the message of safe arrival and this unexpected event to my family through the internet service provided by the hotel. Conceivably, everybody was astonished by this visit to Iceland.

For your information, the currency of Iceland is Krona. One US dollar can exchange for about 100 Krona. As such, the daily purchases in Iceland easily involve thousands and tens of thousands. For example, a regular Tee shirt costs 2500 Krona, equivalent to 25 US dollars. Having to handle such humongous quantity of money in transaction ruined my appetite for shopping. By the way, this is a funny incident. Harris spent 1600 Krona on a regular not too delicious Chinese lunch consisted of noodles, rice and sliced meat...etc. Later on, when he told this to our son, he questioned on the rationale of squandering 1600 dollars on a lunch instead of buying a good quality jacket to keep mommy warm. My heart already got warmed up by this caring expression of my son. Of course, all these misunderstanding stemmed from the lack of knowledge on the exchange rate.

During our second day in Iceland, we shared the table with a black female student during lunch. She was really picky and refused to start eating until the entrée was served even though delicious fish cream chowder and crispy bread were already in front of her. This did not bother us. We quickly enjoyed this delightful lunch. The poor student kept waiting and waiting until the time for cleanup. She regretted, but it was already too late. Why so fussy with just a simple lunch?

Anyway, we seized the opportunity to chat with the student, explaining to her God's blessings. We could sleep on comfortable bed and pillows instead of lying on stone cold airport floor. She could only nod her head in agreement. Just hope that God would work His way into the hearts of these students. Well, at 3 am, we finally flew back to London, on track for continuous adventure.

Due to flight delays, our names have been placed on the waiting list of four different airlines, giving us four chances to get to Hong Kong. We were hopeful that at least the fourth flight could take us. To our disappointment, after waiting for a whole day in anticipation, the staff courteously asked us to leave the airport terminal. There may not be any flights taking off within a week. We will be informed and reimbursed for part of the costs. It seemed like a nightmare to me and I wanted to wake up.

The British airport is one of largest in the world. It takes 15 to 20 minutes to travel between various terminals by bus. All day long, we were shuffling through several terminals. We had to line up for a whole hour just to inquire. These back and forth trips ate up several hours of our time. To make things worse, we lost track of our luggage. I only have my handbag with me.

After waiting for two hours, we finally checked into a hotel. Harris and I decided to waste no time in starting a new route of our tour, enjoying a world of our own. Even though this was my fourth tour in London, it was still mesmerizing. It brought back a cozy

feeling of close to each other. God has never left us alone. Just trust and obey Him and we shall see an open door.

On the night of December 23, we experienced a memorable night of Christmas caroling. We attended the concert presented by the choir of a great church. This was the most beautiful Christmas gift.

A peaceful Christmas Eve was spent on an airplane. We checked into hotel in Hong Kong by December 25 afternoon, and received a warm welcome by the luggage we missed so very much.

Dear God, how little had we lost and how abundant had we gained in this trip! We had not stopped praying in all times and God has provided and guided us in the appropriate moments. How rich is your grace and how great is your love! We have never been abandoned. You took away all our concerns and solved all our problems.
